

What to Pack in Your



Daycare Bag

Age: 4 Years Old

Personal Items (Please label each item with your child's name.)

- 2 Chubby Pencils (Label Each Pencil)
- 1 Composition Book
- 2 - Two Pocket Folder
- 1 - 2" Binder
- Ruler
- Extra Underwear (2)
- 2 **Complete** Weather Appropriate Change of Clothing to Include Socks
- Two (2) Current Pictures of Child

These items are community items to be used by the entire class throughout the school year.

- 4 Glue sticks
- 1 Box of Primary Colored Washable Markers
- 1 Small bottle of Elmer's Glue
- 1 Box of Crayons
- 1 Yellow highlighter
- 3 Baby wipe refill package
- 2 (two) boxes facial tissue - 160 count or larger
- 1 Box - Gallon Sized Zip Lock Storage Bags
- 1 Box - 1 Small Plastic School Box (8x5)
- 1 package multi- purpose copy paper
- 2 containers of Clorox wipes

Please Remember:

Please label all items with child's first and last name.

- All creams and sunscreens to be applied require a completed Medical authorization form and must be kept in their original containers with your child's full name on it.
- All prescriptions must be in the original containers with the patient's Name, dosage and prescribed time to be given. The doctor must complete a medical form before medication can be administered.
- Any over the counter medications (Tylenol, Motrin, etc.) require a Permission form from your doctor which must include the proper dosage for your child's weight, age and the reason why it is to be administered.

Helpful Tips and Reminders

Label Everything

Permanent markers may work fine for labeling plastic bags, diaper boxes or wipe containers, however for items that will come in contact with your baby, purchase a non-toxic marker. Label makers, masking tape or painter's tape are also useful for labeling bottles, while you may want to use iron on labels for clothes and bibs. Label bottles before you store them in the refrigerator; otherwise you will have difficulty writing on them.

Photos

Providing your child's teacher with pictures of you and your family for their classroom will help your child feel at home. Having a familiar face to look at while you are at work helps ease the transition into their new environment.

Fill Out Forms

You may have filled these out in advance, if not, the following forms are needed on the first day - Feeding Form, USDA Application, Shot Record and Medication Form (if applicable).

Clothing

Clothing should be comfortable, making it easy for the children to learn to dress and undress. Buckles, zip, snap pants and overalls make it difficult for children to be independent in school. Elastic waist pants are best for this age group. Outside shoes should be Velcro gym shoes. Please no crocs or opened toe shoes.
